Lifelong Friends And Designers — One Fashion, The Other Interiors — Create A Home That Exudes Pure Style

Sophisticated, clean-lined and classic — one would not expect any less of fashion mogul Michael Kors. Though in this case, it is not the designer's impeccable clothing styles that are being described but his spacious penthouse loft located in New York's iconic West Village.

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Created by interior designer Glenn Gissler of Glenn Gissler Design, this 2,200-square-foot loft, home to Kors and partner Lance Le Pere, imbues a classically modern style. "I have known Glenn for years," Kors says. "He has the ability to know what I want even before I do; how to capture my style and make the spaces fit me like a well-tailored jacket."

Friends for more than 21 years, Kors was Gissler's first client and still continues to work with him. With a background in art and architectural history, Gissler skillfully creates rooms that are at once comfortable, polished and visually striking. It is his elegant yet understated sensibility that results in beautiful

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areas that meld into the existing architecture of the space.

Incorporating hues of white, charcoal and gray, Gissler posed Kors' collection of furnishings by mid-century design greats George Nelson, Mies van der Rohe, Warren Platner and Florence Knoll along with his own custom-designed pieces. Pairing polished stainless steel and chrome, laminate and rich woods with flannel suiting fabric, leather and marble, Gissler strategically used high contrast to create a sense of visual crispness. "Nearly every item with the exception of the classic modern pieces were custom designed to specifically fit this apartment," Gissler says.

Spending so much time working and traveling abroad, Kors needed a home that he could relax in, a place of pure simplicity that would resonate with the luxury look that Kors is known for. "It is a reflection of Michael's dream apartment," Gissler says. "He has been in business for some 27 years, all while maintaining a clear vision of what he wanted from his residence."
